

Per Capita and Household Income Trends -- Loudoun County

Both the per capita income and the median household income are higher in Loudoun County than nationally and in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Loudoun County's median household income of \$107,207 ranked first in the U.S.A. in 2007. The U.S. per capita income for 2007 was \$26,688, and the median household income was \$50,740. In Virginia, the 2007 per capita income was \$31,177, and the median household income was \$59,562. When analyzing and comparing Loudoun's per capita income, keep in mind that the relatively high proportion of children in the county lowers the per capita income.
